**How are you doing now?**

- Does your college or school district have an accident prevention plan?
- If yes – is it formal, communicated, and managed?
- Does the district have a safety goal?
  - What happens if the goal is not met?




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How to Get the **Most** Out of **Your** Safety Program

- Do all employees receive training on safety topics at least monthly?
- Are formal, documented safety surveys conducted at least quarterly?
  - Are work orders developed and managed?
- Is there an incident investigation on every accident to prevent recurrence?




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How to Get the **Most** Out of **Your** Safety Program

### A district needed to make a change – and made it!

Projected loss from 1997-1999	\$ 914,220
Actual losses	\$1,474,528
Projected coverage cost increase for 2000-2001	48%

Negotiated to \$293,970 -

- \* Agreed to contract out Custodial Services
- \* Implement a Loss Prevention Program
